ADDENDUM NO. 1

To whom it may concern:

A. BOILER PLATE

1. Bid Opening will be held on March 5th, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. at the Elizabeth Wirt Volunteer Fire Department, 91 Schoolview Street, Elizabeth, WV.

B. SPECIFICATIONS

1. Refer to Section 012000 – PRICE AND PAYMENT PROCEDURES. **CHANGE** Paragraph 1.7.C to read:

C. Unit Price Schedule:

1. Bid Item 1 – Mobilization/Demobilization

- a. This Bid Item shall include all costs associated with the performance of construction preparatory operations including, but not limited to, the movement of equipment and personnel to and from the Project Site; storage buildings, and other facilities necessary to conduct Work under this Contract; payment of all bonding costs incurred by the Contractor; all materials and equipment required for unloading and reloading; and all costs associated with demobilization.
- b. This Bid Item shall also include all costs associated with installing, maintaining, and removing the Project Sign.
- c. This Bid Item shall also include any and all costs associated with the following Specification Sections:

- 1) Section 012600 – Contract Modification Procedures
- 2) Section 013000 – Administrative Requirements
- 3) Section 013216 – Construction Progress Schedule
- 4) Section 013300 – Submittal Procedures
- 5) Section 015000 – Temporary Facilities and Controls
- 6) Section 017000 – Execution and Closeout Requirements
- 7) Section 017839 – Project Record Documents

d. Partial Payments of the lump sum Bid amount for mobilization/demobilization shall be as follows:

- 1) Two-thirds of the amount Bid for Mobilization/Demobilization can be paid for the Contractor at the first estimate payable.
- 2) The final third of the amount Bid for Mobilization/Demobilization shall be paid with the final payment.
- 3) No reduction, nor increase, will be made in the lump sum amount regardless of decreases or increases in the final total Contract amount or for any other cause.

C. DRAWINGS

1. NOT APPLICABLE

D. QUESTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

The following are clarifications and responses to questions posed by Contractors and suppliers regarding the above referenced project.

1. QUESTION:

Has the liner been removed from the equalization basin? If not, how thick is the liner?

RESPONSE:

The equalization basin liner has not been removed. The liner was originally installed in the 1980s, and the thickness is not known at this time.

2. QUESTION:

How can equipment be brought to the project site?

RESPONSE:

Site access for Contractor equipment is the responsibility of the Contractor and shall be coordinated with the Owner. Any easements required for Contractor access to the WWTP property shall be acquired by the Contractor. The site may be accessed through the main gate located on the WWTP property.

3. QUESTION:

How does the Owner dispose of its own wastewater sludge during the normal course of operation?

RESPONSE:

The Town of Elizabeth disposes of sludge at the Northwestern Landfill along U.S. Rt. 50 near Parkersburg, WV. The landfill is owned and operated by Waste Management.

4. QUESTION:

What is the current state of the Owner's Hazardous Waste Manifest?

RESPONSE:

The Owner Hazardous Waste Manifest is current. A copy of the Manifest is included with this Addendum No. 1 for your use.

5. QUESTION:

Please provide a diagram and section view of the Equalization Basin.

RESPONSE:

The Equalization Basin record drawing is included with the Addendum No. 1 for informational purposes only and is not considered part of the Contract Documents.

6. QUESTION:

Engineers specifications indicate that sludge is to be dewatered to 20% solids, yet payment is to be determined on the basis of dry tonnage removed as measured at the landfill. Engineer's estimated total tonnage is likewise listed in dry tons. Is this listing accurate?

RESPONSE:

As stated in Section 024101.00 Paragraph 3.1.B of the Contract Documents, dry tonnage refers to sludge weight after dewatering to 20% solids. Engineer estimates that the weight of dewatered sludge at 20% solids is 200 tons. Bids will be based on a unit price per ton of sludge disposed at the landfill.

7. QUESTION:

Will water and/or sludge need to be removed from the other two lagoons?

RESPONSE:

No.

8. QUESTION:

In order to accomplish sludge dewatering, access to two (2) 2" water lines at 50 psi of pressure is necessary. What is the water source for this project?

RESPONSE:

Contractor may use existing WWTP effluent as process water for this project. Any further water needs may be provided via hose connections to the plant's own potable water supply. Contractor will be responsible for reimbursing Owner for any water drawn from its potable water supply. The Owner's current water rate tariff for water service is included with this Addendum No. 1 for your use.

9. **QUESTION:**

What are the owner's average and peak daily wastewater flows?

RESPONSE:

Owner treats an average of 120,000 GPD of wastewater and is permitted to treat and discharge up to 150,000 GPD.

10. **QUESTION:**

What is the power situation at the project site?

RESPONSE:

Contractor will be responsible for providing all power requirements of the contract. The current electrical feed is 240 V, 3-phase.

11. **QUESTION:**

Specifications indicate that Contractor must allow 20 days for Engineer to review submittals. This requirement puts excessive strain on the contract schedule, as the contract times only allow 60 days from start-up to substantial completion. May this requirement be waived.

RESPONSE:

No submittal requirements apply to this project.

12. **QUESTION:**

Will the Town of Elizabeth apply for the permit from the DEP to pump water from the river to use on this project?

RESPONSE:

Contractor may use existing WWTP effluent as process water for this project. Any further water needs may be provided via hose connections to the plant's own potable water supply. Contractor will be responsible for reimbursing Owner for any water drawn from its potable water supply. The Owner's current water rate tariff for water service is included with this Addendum No. 1 for your use.

13. QUESTION:

Can the project to fill in the other 2 ponds be delayed so we can use the standing water in them to perform this project.?

RESPONSE:

The Town does not anticipate delaying the lagoon decommissioning contract.

14. QUESTION:

Can you provide the Federal Wage Rates that we are required to use by 2/26/20?

RESPONSE:

Federal Wage Rates are included with this Addendum No. 1 for your use.

15. QUESTION:

Please provide calculations in determining quantity of sludge to be removed.

RESPONSE:

No sludge quantity calculations will be provided.

16. QUESTION:

Specification 024101.00 3.2 C. states that the Contractor is only responsible for coordinating with the Owner to pump down the clean water from the Equalization Basin. In the pre-bid meeting, the Engineer stated that the Contractor was responsible for more than just coordination. The Engineer stated that the Contractor was responsible for pumping the clean water off the lagoon, but that the Owner would assist in looking over the operation. Which is correct? If the Contractor is responsible for removing the clean water off the lagoon, can a pay-item be added for this task?

RESPONSE:

The Owner will be responsible for pumping down the clean water from the Equalization Basin.

17. QUESTION:

Specification 024101.00 3.3 B. states that all equipment lay down areas disturbed shall be graded smooth and be reclaimed with fertilizer, lime, seed, and mulch. Can a pay item be added for this work, as it is a fixed cost?

RESPONSE: Costs associated with reclamation of lay down areas shall be included in the unit price for sludge removal.

18. QUESTION:

Section 012000 1.7 C 1.d states that the total Mobilization/Demobilization cannot exceed 5% of the total bid. With an Engineer's estimate of \$275,000, this limits the mobilization to \$13,750. With most Contractor's for this work not being local and requiring a significant amount of equipment and setup, this will not come close to covering the true Mobilization/Demobilization cost. There are not any fixed cost pay items in the contract to put the rest of the Mobilization/Demobilization costs. Can this 5% restriction be increased? This section also details how the Mobilization will be paid through four pay estimates. With a substantial completion of 60 days, there will only likely be two or three pay estimates on the project. Can this section be revised to reflect the anticipated timescale of this project?

RESPONSE:

See ITEM No. 1 in Part B. SPECIFICATIONS of this ADDENDUM.

19. QUESTION:

Should the bid price exceed 10% of the Engineer's \$275,000 project estimate, is there a possibility that the contract would still be awarded.

RESPONSE:

If, at the time this contract is to be awarded, the lowest total base bid submitted by a qualified, responsible Bidder does not exceed the amount of funds then estimated by the Owner, as available to finance the contract, the construction contract will be awarded. If such bids exceed such amount, the Owner may reject all bids.

20. QUESTION:

When is the anticipated notice to proceed?

RESPONSE:

Notice to Proceed is anticipated to be issued between 45 and 60 after the bid opening date.

21. QUESTION:

The Owner stated during the pre-bid conference that the Equalization Basin will be placed back in service after the cleaning project. The Owner also stated that the existing liner in the lagoon is approximately 35 years old. Most liners do not have a life expectancy of over 20 years. In order to clean all sludge from the lagoon, equipment must be placed on the liner. Will the Contractor be liable for damage to the liner due to its age and current condition and not from Contractor negligence?

RESPONSE:

The Contractor will be responsible for any damage to the liner resulting from the Contractor's work.

I. Rules and Regulations for the Government of Water Utilities, adopted by the Public Service Commission of West Virginia, and now in effect, and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof hereafter made by the Commission are adopted by the Town.

APPLICABILITY

Applicable within the entire territory served

(C) AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE

Available for general domestic, commercial, and industrial service and sale for resale water service.

(I) MINIMUM CHARGE

No minimum bill shall be rendered for less than \$ 28.29 per month.

WATER DISCONNECT-RECONNECT-ADMINISTRATIVE FEES \$25.00

Whenever water service has been disconnected for any reason, a disconnection fee of \$25.00 shall be charged; or in the event the delinquent water bill is collected in the field, an administrative fee of \$25.00 shall be charged. Whenever water service which has been previously disconnected for any reason is reconnected, a reconnection fee of \$25.00 shall be charged.

(C) REFUNDED CHECK CHARGE

A service charge of \$25.00 will be imposed upon any customer whose check for payment of charges is returned by their bank for any reason.

LEAK ADJUSTMENT

\$3.00 per 1,000 gallons is to be used when a bill reflects unusual consumption which can be attributed to eligible leakage on the customer's side of the meter. This rate shall be applied to all such consumption above the customer's historical average usage.

SECURITY DEPOSIT

A \$50.00 deposit or 2 ½ percent of the average usage of the applicant's specific class, whichever is greater.

POWER EQUIPMENT OPERATOR CLASSIFICATIONS:

GROUP 1: Cranes, tower cranes, derricks, derrick boats, draglines, clamshells, cableways, boom truck, loaders of 6 cubic yard capacity and over, excavators and shovels with an operating weight of 110,000 pounds and over.

GROUP 2: Loaders up to 6 cubic yard capacity, gradall, hoist 2 drums or more, mixer plant (2 or more mixers including batch control), pile driver operator, core drill, trencher, backhoe, asphalt paver, cement paver, rotary drill, bulldozers, concrete pump, controlled fine grade machine, slip form paver, log loader, log skidder, motor grader, rubber tired scraper, tractor pan, Roto Miller, tow or work boat, mobile conveyor, transloader, articulating equipment, material hauler, carry deck, compactor with blade, skidsteer including attachments, fork lift, self-propelled concrete spreader, concrete finishing machine, derrick (single drum), hoist (single drum), single drum paver, air tugger, Ross Carrier, multiple concrete saw, hydraulic post driver, horizontal road-boring machine, tie distributor, track lining machine, ballast tamper, anchor application machine, ribbon rail puller, ballast regulator, auto sled, turn table, pavement breaker, asphalt batch plant, concrete batch plant, crushing plant, compactor with blade, power broom, vac-all truck, self-propelled concrete spreader and concrete finishing machine, mechanics with tools and greasers, excavators, and shovels with an operating weight of up to 110,000 pounds.

GROUP 3: Asphalt roller

GROUP 4: Air compressor, concrete mixer (under 1 cubic yard), light plant, mechanic's tender, assistant engineer, screedman, spreader box man, joint sealer and pump, steam jenny, stationary conveyor (belt or bucket), A-frame, tire man, screening and washing plant, form sub-grader, power form handling equipment, burlap and curing machine, form grader, bull float, bar and joint installing machine, roller and compactor, hydroblaster, concrete mixer (single drum, 1 cu. yd. or over), portable concrete saw and highway striping operator. Utility operators shall be paid Group 2 rate when operating 1 to 5 air compressors, pumps, stationary conveyors (belt or bucket), light plants, and gasoline or diesel powered welders and all farm type tractors.

GROUP 5B: Those operating off-road trucks in the following counties: Cabell, Lincoln, Logan, Mason, Mingo, and Wayne.

GROUP 5C: Those operating off-road trucks in the following

counties: Berkeley, Grant, Hampshire, Hardy, Jefferson, Mineral, Morgan and Pendleton.

FOOTNOTE: \$2.00 per hour shall be added to the Group 1 rate for individuals operating a lattice boom crane with a fixed boom of 150 feet or more. \$0.25 per hour shall be added to all of the above schedules for underground work.

TRUCK DRIVER CLASSIFICATIONS:

GROUP 1: Single Axle Trucks used as Dumps, Supply, Fuel, Water, Van, Flatbody, Monorail, Distributor (other than Bituminous Distributors) including Towed Single Units, Material Checkers and Receivers, Greasers, Tireman and Mechanic Tenders (Trucks), Warehouse, Yardmen and Pick-up trucks.

GROUP 2: Tandem and Tri-Axle Trucks used as Dumps, Supply, Fuel, Water, Van, Flatbody, Monorail and including Towed Single Units, Truck Tractors used in combination with Dump, Van, Tank, Flatbed, Low platform or Pole Trailers, Bituminous Distributors, Agitator or Mixer Trucks (up to 20 cubic-yards), Rubber-tired tractors (towing and pushing), Drag and Tag-alongs.

GROUP 3: Mobile Metered Mixer, Agitator or Mixer Trucks (over 20 cubic yards), & Mechanic Truck.

A. Double Hitch equipment operated by 1 driver shall pay 50% more than the wages set out above.

B. \$0.25 per hour shall be added for tunneling and all other underground work.

WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

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Note: Executive Order (EO) 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors applies to all contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract is awarded (and any solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2017. If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must provide employees with 1 hour of paid sick leave for every 30 hours they work, up to 56 hours of paid sick leave each year. Employees must be permitted to use paid sick leave for their own illness, injury or other health-related needs, including preventive care; to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is ill, injured, or has other health-related needs, including preventive care; or for reasons resulting from, or to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is a victim of, domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking. Additional information on contractor requirements and worker protections under the EO is available at www.dol.gov/whd/govcontracts.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests

for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
