TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

A mandatory Pre-Bid Conference was held on Thursday, February 24, 2022, on the above-referenced project, a copy of the sign in sheet is included in this Addendum. The following are clarifications and responses to questions posed by contractors for the above reference project.

Please acknowledge receipt of all Addenda in the Bid Opening Requirements and in the Bid Form.

A. GENERAL

1. Bids for the construction of the Project will be received by City of Weston Sanitary Board, at the office of The Thrasher Group, Inc., located at 600 White Oaks Boulevard, P.O. Box 940 Bridgeport, Harrison County, WV 26330 until 2:00 pm local time on Thursday, March 10, 2022.
2. The last day for questions was March 3, 2022 at noon.

See attached Plant Record Drawings Sheet 4, 5D, 7A, 17, 17A and 17B for the Contractor's use.

D. QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

QUESTION

- 1. Is Contract #2 required to provide a Field Office for the engineer's representative?**

RESPONSE

No.

QUESTION

- 2. Is Contract #2 required to provide a Project Sign?**

RESPONSE

No.

QUESTION

- 3. Does Lewis County require any building permits, B&O Taxes, etc.?**

RESPONSE

No.

QUESTION

- 4. Is a WV Contractor's License required for this project?**

RESPONSE

No. Contractors who have performed dewatering and sludge removal in the past have been granted an exemption from the Contractor Licensing Act through the WV Division of Labor. Therefore, a West Virginia Contractor's License is not a requirement to perform the work on this contract.

QUESTION

- 5. Can you provide a contact for Waste Management?**

RESPONSE

Yes. Michael Lovato mlovato1@wm.com and Guy Lambert glambert@wm.com from Waste Management are familiar with this project. (412) 269-5322.

QUESTION

6. Does the plant have an existing waste profile approval set up with Waste Management landfill in Bridgeport or any other disposal site?

RESPONSE

No. The plant does not have a recent waste profile available at this time.

QUESTION

7. Does the Weston Sanitary Board want to pay for the disposal cost directly?

RESPONSE

No. The Contractor is responsible for all costs associated with the sludge disposal.

QUESTION

8. Is there a Bid Bond Required?

RESPONSE

Yes. The AFB (Advertisement for Bid) states, bids shall be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond payable to City of Weston Sanitary Board in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the base bid.

QUESTION

9. Can a long reach excavator be used to remove the sludge, leaving enough sludge in the bottom to safely guard against damage?

RESPONSE

Yes. Provided there is no damage caused to the 60 mil liner in the bottom of the basin. There is an HDPE liner in the bottom of the tank and not a concrete floor. Any damage to the liner will be the responsibility of the contractor to repair. If other methods are required to remove the plan quantity of sludge, then they shall be implemented at no additional cost to the project.

QUESTION

10. Is electric available for the Contractor to use?

RESPONSE

Yes. The Weston Sanitary Board will supply 3 phase 480 volt power on two 80 amp breakers that is located near the southeast corner of Sludge Holding Cell #1 at no cost to the Contractor.

Any additional power requirements is the responsibility of the Contractor including installation and power costs.

QUESTION

11. Can drawings of the tanks be provided?

RESPONSE

Yes. See attached Record Drawings Sheet 4, 5D, 7A, 17, 17A, 17B that shows the Sludge Holding Cells and elevation views.

QUESTION

12. Will the Weston Sanitary Board decant the supernatant water?

RESPONSE

The Weston Sanitary Board can decant to the level of the telescopic valve at the contractor's request. The travel length of the TSV is 6' to an elevation of 1021.00. See attached Record Drawing Sheet 17 and 17A. The remaining supernatant can be pumped into the pump station near the southeast corner of the EQ Basin as long as there is no disruption to the plant effluent. Supernatant can also be pumped into the EQ Basin, identified as Sludge Holding Cell #1 on the Record Drawings, without a maximum flow rate. The cost of decanting the supernatant water shall be included in the Dry Ton Unit Bid Cost.

QUESTION

13. Where can filtrate water from the sludge dewatering equipment be returned to the plant?

RESPONSE

The Contractor will have the option to return the water into the sludge holding tank for mixing water, or into the EQ Basin.

QUESTION

14. Is there water available for the Contractor to use?

RESPONSE

Yes. The attached Record Drawing Sheet 7A depicts the location of a fire hydrant near the entrance of the plant and the yard hydrants around the plant. The fire hydrant is fed with a 6" potable waterline with a static pressure of approximately 70 PSI. The yard hydrants around the plant are fed through a 2" waterline from the plant effluent water. Contractors from past sludge

removal projects placed a pump in the UV Basin for a source of water prior to the yard hydrants being transferred from potable water to non-potable water. There will be no cost associated for using plant effluent water. If potable water is required, the Contractor must enter into an agreement with West Virginia American Water to purchase water directly through the fire hydrant.

QUESTION

15. Can the Owner collect sludge samples, obtain analysis, and establish the waste profile prior to the award?

RESPONSE

No. The Contractor is responsible for obtaining sludge samples, analysis and establishing the waste profile. The Owner can provide assistance for obtaining sludge samples.

QUESTION

16. Is disinfection required for structures in this contract?

RESPONSE

No. No additional work is required on this contract to require disinfection of structures.

QUESTION

17. Will changes to the Agreement and General Conditions be considered?

RESPONSE

No. The Agreement and General Conditions are to remain unchanged in the Contract Documents.

E. CLARIFICATIONS

1. Davis Bacon Wage Rates apply to this project. The attached updated Wage Rates shall replace the Wage Rates listed in the specifications for this contract.

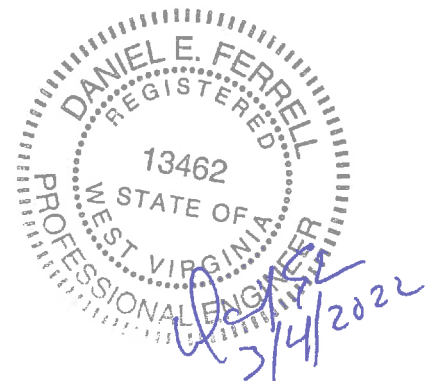

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

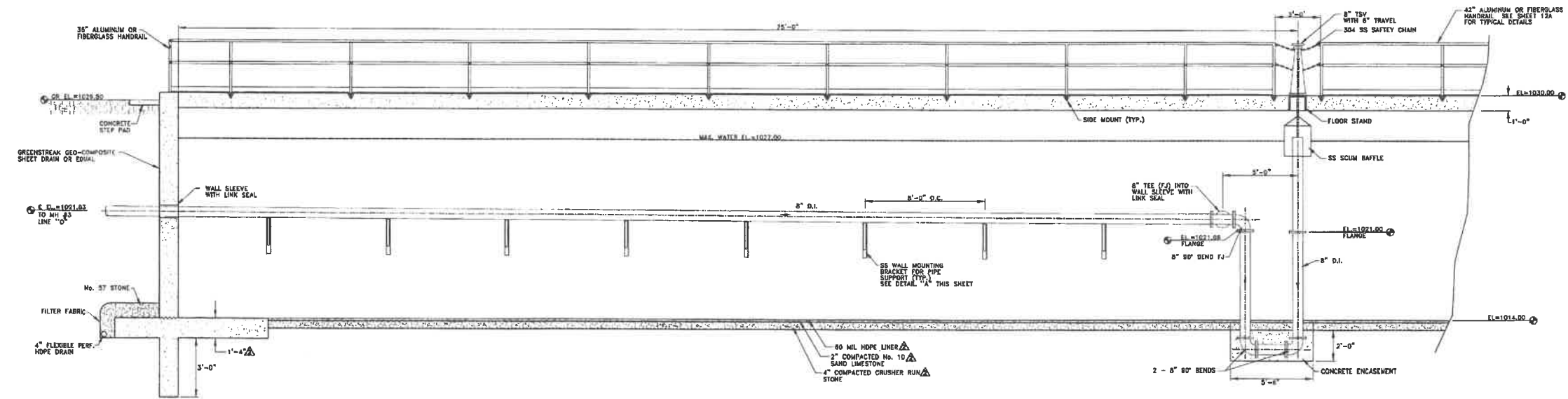
