TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

A Pre-Bid Conference was held on Thursday, March 17, 2022 on the above-referenced project, a copy of the sign in sheet is included in this Addendum. The following are clarifications and responses to questions posed by contractors for the above reference project.

A. GENERAL

- 1. THE BID FORM HAS BEEN REVISED. YOU MUST USE THE REVISED BID FORM WHEN PREPARING YOUR BID PACKAGE FOR THIS PROJECT.
- 2. Mobilization costs can not exceed 10% of the overall construction costs.
- 3. New plans sheets have been added to this Addendum. The plans now include painting the lead in lines from the taxiway to the runway. This changed the SF quantities of paint.
- 4. The Contractor shall outline all pavement markings in black per AC 150/5340-M. Examples can be found in Appendix C of the document. The black paint outline shall be made incidental to the square foot price of pavement markings.
- 5. Successful contractor will be required to develop a plan with the Engineer and Airport that minimizes the number of days the airport is closed or partial closed for painting. Advanced notice will be required to inform the airport tenants and pilots.

D. QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

QUESTION

1. What size for the replacement panels? The L-125 and the Sign Legend Schedule indicate a mix of size 1 and size 2. Our records for Raleigh County Memorial show only size 1. In addition, 11 out of the 30 signs on the Sign Legend Schedule have a mix of size 1 and size 2 panels, which should not be possible.

RESPONSE

There are two different manufacturers of signs on the airfield lumacurve and adbalnaco. Lumacurve branded signs are all size 1. A few of the signs at runway thresholds have a newer lumacurve sign next to an older adb-alnaco trapezoidal sign which conform to the measurements of size 2 criteria.

QUESTION

2. If I am interpreting this correctly any size 1 sign/panel is Lumacurve. And any sign on the sign schedule (#s 1, 5. 24, 31, 48, 67, 75) that show both size 1 and size 2 panels at the same sign is a co-located size 1 Lumacurve and size 2 ADB Trapezoid.

RESPONSE

Yes. See picture below.



QUESTION

3. Can roadway glass beads that are used for the WVDOH be used?

RESPONSE

No. Glass beads for white and yellow paint shall meet the requirements for Federal Specification TT-B-1325D Type I, Gradation A.

QUESTION

4. What type of line removal method should be used grinding, power washing or can we paint over the existing lines?

RESPONSE

Prior to remarking existing markings, loose existing markings must be removed minimizing damage to the pavement surface, with a method approved by the resident project representative employed by Thrasher. After removal, the surface shall be cleaned of all residue or debris before new paint is applied.

OUESTION

5. Will one coat of paint be sufficient, or will two coats be required?

RESPONSE

One coat is sufficient at the maximum rate of 115 SF/Gallon.

OUESTION

6. What percentage of the work must be completed by the prime contractor?

RESPONSE

The prime contractor must complete a minimum of 50% of the contract work.

OUESTION

7. Are the signs lighted?

RESPONSE

Yes the signs are lighted.

OUESTION

8. How many lighted X's for closing the runway will be needed for this project?

RESPONSE

The number of lighted X's varies depending on the phase of the project. Please see plans for location and amount of lighted X's.

QUESTION

9. Can we paint at night?

RESPONSE

No, the contractor will be required to pain in the daytime.

E. CLARIFICATIONS

GENERAL

The total Bid cost stated includes a complete operating installation including furnishing and installation of any and all changes or additions in plans, piping, mechanical work, additional electrical work, accessories, controls, etc. necessary to accommodate alternative equipment systems or materials used in construction.

- 2. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- 3. Bidder is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- 4. Bidder has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
- 5. Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
- 6. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
- 8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- 9. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and of discrepancies between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.

- 3. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL MARK AND LIGHT AREAS UNDER CONSTRUCTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS. AIRCRAFT AND PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL NOT BE COMPROMISED AND PROPER SEPARATION SHALL BE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES.
- 4. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE THE ENGINEER AND OWNER WITH TWO (2) DAY ADVANCE WRITTEN NOTICE PRIOR TO ANY CLOSURE OF RUNWAY 1-19 AND 10-28. THE OWNER WILL COORDINATE THE CLOSURE WITH ALL TENANTS AND USERS OF THE AIRPORT AND ISSUE THE APPROPRIATE NOTAMS.
- 5. CLOSED RUNWAY AND TAXIWAY MARKERS AND BARRICADES SHALL BE INSTALLED AS THE FIRST TASK IN ANY WORK AREA AND SHALL BE REMOVED AS THE LAST TASK. THE CLOSED MARKERS AND BARRICADES SHALL NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL THE PAVEMENT AND SAFETY AREAS ARE ESTABLISHED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND ARE SUITABLE FOR USE BY AIRCRAFT. THE CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIVE SHALL BE ON CALL 24 HOURS A DAY FOR EMERGENCY MAINTENANCE OF AIRPORT MARKERS, BARRICADES, ETC DURING THE LIFE OF THE PROEJCT.
- 6. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL BARRICADES ACROSS ALL ACTIVE PAVED AIRCRAFT OPERATIONAL AREAS ADJACENT TO THE CONSTRUCTION AREAS AS SHOWN ON THE PLANS OR AS ORDERED BY THE ENGINEER (NO PAY ITEM).
- 7. REFER TO THE CLOSED MARKER AND BARRICADE SCHEDULE" FOR THE MARKERS AND BARRICADES REQUIRED FOR EACH PHASE.
- 8. THE CONTRACTOR MAY BE REQUIRED TO RELOCATE THE CLOSED MARKERS AND BARRICADES DURING THE PROJECT. IF REQUIRED, THE MULTIPLE RELOCATIONS OF THE BARRICADES SHALL BE INCIDENTAL TO THE PROJECT. THE LOCATION OF THE BARRICADES, AS SHOWN ON THE PLANS, REPRESENTS THE MOST TYPICAL LOCATIONS. OTHER LOCATIONS MAY BE REQUIRED AS ORDERED BY THE ENGINEER.
- 9. ALL RUNWAY LIGHTS, APPROACH LIGHTS, AND VISUAL AIDS SHALL BE DE-ENERGIZED WHEN THE RUNWAY IS CLOSED. LIGHTS SHALL BE RE-ENERGIZED CONCURRENT WITH THE OPENING OF THE RUNWAY (NO SEPARATE PAY ITEM). REMOVING THE LAMP FROM FIXTURES SHALL NOT BE THE METHOD SELECTED.
- 10. ALL TAXIWAY LIGHTS SHALL BE DE-ENERGIZED OR PROPERLY COVERED WHEN THE CORRESPONDING TAXIWAY IS CLOSED. LIGHTS SHALL BE RE-ENERGIZED OR UNCOVERED CONCURRENT WITH THE OPENING OF THE TAXIWAY NO SEPARATE PAY ITEM). REMOVING THE LAMP FROM FIXTURES SHALL NOT BE THE METHOD SELECTED.
- 11. PRIOR TO REOPENING THE RUNWAY AND TAXIWAYS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL CLEAN ALL DEBRIS (FOD) FROM THE PAVEMENT SURFACES. DEBRIS IS DAMAGING TO AIRCRAFT ENGINES AND MAY BECOME PROJECTILES WHEN THROWN BY ENGINES.
- 12. REFER TO THE PHASING DETAILS SHEET FOR DETAILS OF CLOSED MARKERS, BARRICADES, AND FAA PART 77 SURFACES.
- 13. PRIOR TO BEGINNING WORK IN EACH AREA, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE ENGINEER AND CONFIRM THAT THE PROPER NOTAMS HAVE BEEN ISSUED AND ARE ON FILE.

- 14. AIRCRAFT SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY AT ALL TIMES. CONTRACTOR VEHICLES SHALL GIVE WAY TO AIRCRAFT AT ALL TIMES.
- 15. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROTECT EXISTING UTILITIES AND FACILITIES (i.e., AIRPORT LIGHTING, NAVAIDS, ETC.) FROM DAMAGE BY EQUIPMENT OR PERSONNEL.
- 16. ANY MARKED OR UNMARKED UTILITIES OR FACILITIES DAMAGED DURING THE PROJECT BY THE CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL OR EQUIPMENT SHALL BE PROMPTLY REPAIRED AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE.
- 17. THE CONTRACTORS STAGING AREA, HAUL ROUTES, SITE ACCESS ROADS AND ANY OTHER AREAS SHALL BE MAINTAINED AND RESTORED TO THEIR ORIGINAL CONDITION.
- 18. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR OBTAINING ALL PERMITS, LICENSES, ETC. REQUIRED BY LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL AGENCIES. THE CONTRACTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYING ALL B&O TAXES WITH THE CITY.
- 19. THE OWNER RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CONTRACT AND PERFORM ADDITIONAL WORK ADJACENT TO AND WITHIN THE WORK AREA COVERED BY THIS CONTRACT. WHEN SEPARATE CONTRACTS ARE LET WITHIN THE LIMITS OF ANY ONE PROJECT, EACH CONTRACTOR SHALL CONDUCT HIS WORK SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE WITH OR HINDER THE PROGRESS OR THE COMPLETION OF THE WORK BEING COMPLETED BY OTHER CONTRACTORS. THE CONTRACTORS WORKING ON THE SAME PROJECT SHALL COOPERATE WITH EACH OTHER AS ORDERED BY THE ENGINEER.
- 20. THE CONTRACTOR'S FORMAN OR SUPERINTENDENT ON SITE SHALL CARRY IN HIS OR HER POSSESSION AN AIR TO GROUND RADIO THAT IS CAPABLE OF COMMUNICATING WITH AIRPORT STAFF.
- 21. REFERENCE FOR COORDINATE SYSTEM, WEST VIRGINIA STATE PLANE COORDINATES SOUTH, NAD 1983.
- 22. UPON NOTIFICATION FROM THE AIRPORT MANAGER, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL IMMEDIATELY CLEAR THE TAXIWAY AND/OR APRON OF EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL IN THE EVENT OF DECLARED AIRCRAFT EMERGENCY.
- 23. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL OUTLINE ALL PAVEMENT MARKINGS IN BLACK PER AC 150/5340-M. EXAMPLES CAN BE FOUND IN APPENDIX C OF THE DOCUMENT. THE BLACK PAINT OUTLINE SHALL BE MADE INCIDENTAL TO THE SQUARE FOOT PRICE OF PAVEMENT MARKINGS.

COORDINATION

PHASING

THE CONTRACT DEADLINE FOR THIS PROJECT IS 150 DAYS FOR COMPLETION. THIS PROJECT IS BROKEN DOWN INTO FOUR PHASES. THIS WILL REQUIRE COORDINATION BETWEEN CONTRACTOR, ENGINEER, AND AIRPORT SPONSOR. OUTLINED BELOW ARE THE CONSTRUCTION PHASES:

PHASE 1: CLOSURE OF A PORTION OF RUNWAY 1-19 FOR REMOVAL OF EXISTING PAVEMENT MARKINGS AND PLACEMENT OF NEW PAVEMENT MARKINGS.

PHASE 2: CLOSURE OF RUNWAY 1-19 AND 10-28 FOR REMOVAL OF EXISTING PAVEMENT MARKINGS AND PLACEMENT OF NEW PAVEMENT MARKINGS AT RUNWAY INTERSECTION.

PHASE 3: CLOSURE OF RUNWAY 1-19 AND 10-28 FOR REPLACEMENT OF SPECIFIC RUNWAY AND TAXIWAY SIGNAGE WITHIN THE RUNWAY SAFETY AREAS.

PHASE 4: REPLACEMENT OF SPECIFIC RUNWAY AND TAXIWAY SIGNAGE THAT ARE NOT WITHIN THE RUNWAY SAFETY AREAS.

AREAS AND OPERATIONS AFFECTED BY THE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY
THE CONTRACTOR'S FOREMAN OR SUPERINTENDENT ON SITE SHALL CARRY IN HIS OR
HER POSSESSION AN AIR TO GROUND RADIO THAT IS CAPABLE OF COMMUNICATIONS.
IN ADDITION EACH CONTRACTOR'S VEHICLE SHALL DISPLAY AMBER FLASHING
STROBE LIGHTS OR ORANGE AND WHITE CHECKERED FLAGS WHEN OPERATING ON
THE AIRFIELD IN ACCORDANCE TO AC 150/5210-5. THE CONTRACTOR IS TO LIMIT THE
NUMBER OF VEHICLES THAT WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE MOVEMENT AREAS. PRIOR
TO CROSSING INTO MOVEMENT AREAS OR SAFETY AREAS CONTRACTORS SHALL
COMMUNICATE THRU TWO WAY RADIOS TO ENSURE A PLANE IS NOT IN THE VICINITY
TO LAND. ALL PERSONS SHALL BE TRAINED FOLLOWING 139,329 REQUIREMENTS.
RECORDS SHALL BE KEPT BY THE AIRPORT OF EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO COMPLETED A
TRAINING COURSE AND SHALL BE MAINTAINED FOR 24 CONSECUTIVE MONTHS.
ACCIDENTS OR INCIDENTS IN THE MOVEMENT AND/OR SAFETY AREAS INVOLVING AN
AIRCRAFT, VEHICLE OR PEDESTRIAN SHALL BE RECORDED AND KEPT FOR 12
CONSECUTIVE MONTHS FROM DATE OF INCIDENT.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

PRIOR TO THE END OF THE WORK DAY CONTRACTOR SHALL WALK WORK AREA AND PICK UP ANY TRASH OR DEBRIS.

CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE TEMPORARY DRAINAGE DURING CONSTRUCTION TO AVOID STANDING WATER IN EXCAVATED AREAS.

FOREIGN OBJECT DEBRIS MANAGEMENT

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR TO MAINTAIN A CLEAN PROJECT SITE FREE FROM THE THREAT OF FOREIGN OBJECT DEBRIS (FOD). THE CONTRACTOR AND ITS EMPLOYEES WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING THE PROJECT AREA AND KEEPING IT FREE FROM FOD WHETHER IT IS GENERATED FROM THE PROJECT SITE OR OTHER AIRFIELD AREAS.

NOTIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

THE CONTRACTOR SUPERINTENDENT WILL BE SUPPLIED WITH A CONTACT LIST OF ALL PERSONNEL WHO SHOULD BE NOTIFIED FOR UPDATES AND/OR EMERGENCIES. THE AIRPORT MANAGER SHALL BE NOTIFIED 48 HOURS PRIOR TO CLOSING OF RUNWAY/TAXIWAYS FOR NOTAM NOTICES CAN BE ISSUED.

INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS

AIRPORT PERSONNEL WILL CONDUCT DAILY INSPECTIONS TO THE PROJECT AREAS PRE AND POST CONSTRUCTION. THE ENGINEER, AND AIRPORT CONTRACT WILL BE ONSITE TO CONDUCT FINAL INSPECTION (PUNCH LIST) TO ENSURE THE PROJECT WAS COMPLETED PER PLANS AND SPECS.

UNDERGROUND UTILITIES

THERE ARE UNDERGROUND UTILITIES ARE PRESENT WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA. HOWEVER, THEY ARE IN CONDUIT AND/OR CASING AND DUE TO THE LIMIT EXCAVATION ON THIS PROJECT, THERE SHOULD BE NO CONFLICT WITH THESE UTILITIES.
