A Pre-Bid Conference was held on Wednesday, June 14, 2023, on the above-referenced project. The following are clarifications and responses to questions posed by contractors for the above reference project.

D. QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

QUESTION

1. The DBE Goal listed in the Advertisement is 2.99%, but the DBE Goal in the Bid Form is 5.21%. What is the correct DBE Goal?

RESPONSE

The DBE Goal for this project is 5.21%

QUESTION

2. Notes on Sheet 23 states that the ditch dimensions are shown on the ditch schedule. Can you direct me to where I can find the ditch schedule?

RESPONSE

All ditches can follow the typical section as shown on the vegetated ditch detail. Depth of ditches vary and should refer to the cross sections.

QUESTION

3. Can you provide dimensions on Detail A, Sheet 26, for the width across the top of the stone backfill.

RESPONSE

Detail has been revised on Sheet 26.

QUESTION

4. How will the topsoil placement be paid?

RESPONSE

A new bid item for topsoil has been added to the bid tab. The measurement/payment of this item in spec section T-905 shall be replaced with the following: The measurement of topsoil obtained off the site shall be measured by the number of cubic yards of topsoil measured in its original position and stripped or excavated. Topsoil shall be measured by volume in cubic yards computer by the method of end areas. The basis of payment will be made at the contract unit price per cubic yard for topsoil obtained off the site. This price shall be full compensation for furnishing all materials and for all preparation, placing and spreading of the materials and for all the labor, equipment, tools and incidentals necessary to complete the item.

OUESTION

5. Is there a required D-Load on the 36" RCP?

RESPONSE

Class III.

QUESTION

6. Is there a trench detail for the 6" Solid Outlet Pipes, (Trench width, Type of backfill)

RESPONSE

Detail for the solid outlet pipe should follow detail on Sheet 25 for bedding for storm pipe.

QUESTION

7. Can the demolished concrete and asphalt be wasted somewhere on site? If so, where?

RESPONSE

Contractor is responsible for hauling removed concrete/asphalt offsite.

OUESTION

8. Can you clarify if there is topsoil available at the airport? If so, where?

RESPONSE

Please see Response to Question 4.

QUESTION

9. Can you provide the CAD file for bidding purposes?

RESPONSE

Yes, attached CAD waiver please fill out and send to <u>bashley@thethrashergroup.com</u> and cad files will be released.

QUESTION

10. Can the bid date be extended?

RESPONSE

No. Due to funding deadline we are unable to adjust the bid date.

QUESTION

11. Are all environmental permits in hand that will all contractor to start once project is awarded?

RESPONSE

Yes. WV DEP Permit active under WVR108571 and an existing FAA Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) dated July 2006.

QUESTION

12. Assuming this project won't start until mid-August. Will contractor be given winter shutdown for asphalt or weather days in the winter?

RESPONSE

If weather conditions exceed normal weather days outlined in the specifications, then additional time will be added to the Contractor's contract at no additional cost to the Owner.

OUESTION

13. Is the site balanced?

RESPONSE

The amount of cut is approximately 22,466 cubic yards and the fill is 10,601 cubic yards. The remaining excavated material is to the hauled to the end of Runway 23 fill embankment (following existing haul route) and placed per specifications in an area determined by the Engineer.

Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
- 8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
