# TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

A Pre-Bid Conference was held on Tuesday, August 8, 2023, on the above-referenced project, a copy of the sign in sheet is included in this Addendum. The following are clarifications and responses to questions posed by contractors for the above reference project.

- 2. <u>DAVIS BACON WAGES APPLY TO THIS PROJECT. THE UPDATED DAVIS BACON WAGE RATES ATTACHMENT HAS BEEN ADDED AS PART OF THIS ADDENDUM.</u>
- 3. The method of award has been modified to clarify that the TOTAL PROJECT BID is the summation of the GENERAL, AREA 1, and AREA 2 BID. Correct math will prevail if a discrepancy is found.

# D. QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

# **QUESTION**

1. Does the City of Grafton have a preferred location for waste disposal, temporary office, or laydown yard?

# RESPONSE

No site has yet been identified. However, contractors may contact the Grafton City Manager, Kevin Stead at (304)-265-1412 for possible information regarding waste disposal, temporary field office, and material laydown yard.

# **QUESTION**

2. Does the asphalt paving restoration on Sheets 1 & 2 need to be High Friction Surface Treatment?

# **RESPONSE**

The asphalt restoration should be Bid as defined in the Technical Specifications and Plans Issued for Bidding, however its possible that during construction these quantities may change. If there is a material change to the quantity of Full Width HMA Overlay, it will be addressed as outlined in section 13.03.E of the General Conditions in the Contract Documents.

# **QUESTION**

3. Will AY McDonald be an acceptable manufacturer for all brass/copper that is specified as Ford Meter Box?

# RESPONSE

Yes, AY McDonald is an acceptable manufacturer.

# **QUESTION**

4. As stated on page 331219-2 in the specifications, can you verify which manufacturer/model fire hydrant will match 33% of the existing fire hydrants in the Owners existing system?

# **RESPONSE**

Clow Valve Co., Model F-2640 will match 33% of the hydrants in the Owners existing system.

# **QUESTION**

5. Does American Iron and Steel (AIS) compliance apply to this project?

# RESPONSE

AIS compliance does **NOT** apply to this project.

# **QUESTION**

6. Does Build America, Buy American Act (BABAA) compliance apply to this project?

# **RESPONSE**

BABA compliance does **NOT** apply to this project.

# **QUESTION**

7. Will Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation goals be met if materials are purchased through a DBE?

# RESPONSE

DBE participation goals will only be met by the utilization of DBE laborers, not by procurement of materials from a DBE firm.

If such documents are found to be in order, Envelope No. 2 "Bid Proposal", will be opened and will be publicly read aloud. If the documents required to be contained in Envelope No. 1 <u>are not in order</u>, Envelope No. 2 "Bid Proposal", <u>will not be opened</u> and the Bid will be considered non-responsive.

- 2. Mailed/Shipped bid packages shall be sent to the attention of Kevin Watkins at The Taylor County Courthouse, Tony J. Veltri Annex Building, 128 West Main Street, Grafton WV 26354. Phone Number (304)-265-5450. Bidders should **not** assume guaranteed early delivery is available and shall be mailed/shipped in sufficient time. Sealed Bids will be received until 10:00 AM local time on August 22, 2023, at which time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read.
- 3. The anticipated construction start date is approximately 90 days after Bid Opening.
- 4. There will be NO B&O taxes on this project.

# ARTICLE 3—BASIS OF BID—LUMP SUM BID AND UNIT PRICES

# **GENERAL**

The Bidder shall take notice of and shall be responsible for any local or state taxes levied and applicable, and the cost for the same shall be included as part of the submitted Bid.

The total Bid cost stated includes a complete operating installation including furnishing and installation of any and all changes or additions in plans, piping, mechanical work, additional electrical work, accessories, controls, etc. necessary to accommodate alternative equipment systems or materials used in construction.

# **BID PROPOSAL**

The Bidder agrees to perform all required Work described in the detailed Specifications and as shown on the Plans for the complete construction and placing in satisfactory operation the Pruntytown Sewer Extension Project. The Project "Sequence of Construction" has been detailed in the Drawings and Specification Division 1, Project Summary, Section 011000. The Bidder agrees to perform all the Work proposed for the total of the following Bid prices.

# 3.04 Method of Award

If at the time this contract is to be awarded, the lowest **TOTAL PROJECT BID** (summation of **Total Area I Bid** and **Total Area II Bid**) submitted by a qualified, responsive, responsible Bidder does not exceed the amount of funds then estimated by the Owner, as available to finance the contract, the construction contract will be awarded. If such bids exceeds such amount, the owner may reject all bids.

- A. Unit prices have been computed in accordance with paragraph 13.03.A of the General Conditions.
- B. Bidder acknowledges that estimated quantities are not guaranteed, and are solely for the purpose of comparison of Bids, and final payment for all Unit Price Bid items will be based on actual quantities, determined as provided in the Contract Documents.

# ARTICLE 4 BASIS OF BID COST-PLUS FEE

- 4.01 The Contract Price will be the Cost of the Work, determined as provided in Paragraph 13.01 of the General Conditions, together with the following fee, and subject to the Guaranteed Maximum Price.
- 4.02 Contractor's Fee

  - 5. Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.



GROUP 1: Cranes, tower cranes, derricks, derrick boats, draglines, clamshells, cableways, boom truck, loaders of 6 cubic yard capacity and over, excavators and shovels with an operating weight of 110,000 pounds and over.

TRUCK DRIVER CLASSIFICATIONS:

GROUP 1: Single Axle Trucks used as Dumps, Supply, Fuel, Water, Van, Flatbody, Monorail, Distributor (other than Bituminous Distributors) including Towed Single Units, Material Checkers and Receivers, Greasers, Tireman and Mechanic Tenders (Trucks), Warehouse, Yardmen and Pick-up trucks.

GROUP 2: Tandem and Tri-Axle Trucks used as Dumps, Supply, Fuel, Water, Van, Flatbody, Monorail and including Towed Single Units, Truck Tractors used in combination with Dump, Van, Tank, Flatbed, Low platform or Pole Trailers, Bituminous Distributors, Agitator or Mixer Trucks (up to 20 cubic-yards), Rubber-tired tractors (towing and pushing), Drag and Tagalongs.

GROUP 3: Mobile Metered Mixer, Agitator or Mixer Trucks (over 20 cubic yards), & Mechanic Truck.

A. Double Hitch equipment operated by 1 driver shall pay 50% more than the wages set out above.

B. \$0.25 per hour shall be added for tunneling and all other underground work.

WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

Note: Executive Order (EO) 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors applies to all contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract is awarded (and any solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2017. If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must provide employees with 1 hour of paid sick leave for every 30 hours they work, up to 56 hours of paid sick leave each year. Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local),

a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

# Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

# Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

# Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
